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Program Vision

- Foster equity, inclusion, and access in educational and clinical environments
- Support the rights of persons with disabilities to participate in an inclusive education system
- Create a nursing workforce reflective of the diverse patient populations they serve
- Create meaningful change in nursing education and clinical practice

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Program Highlights

- Three years of annual support ranging from \$50,000 to \$75,000 in total costs, inclusive of indirect costs which are capped at 10%.
- Regular meetings of grantees to share challenges and successes and to create a community of practice.

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Eligibility Criteria

- At least one Principal Investigator must hold a degree in nursing (e.g., MS, DNP, PhD) and have an active role in clinical practice and/or teaching

- Proposals should directly impact the experience of nursing students, with focus on the clinical learning environment
- Letters of support from either or both the nursing school and their affiliated health system leadership with matching support

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Important Criteria

- Projects must be led by or developed with authentic partnership with individuals and communities who experience inequities caused by ableism
- Strong evidence of nursing students designing and leading the project
- Projects must focus on issues arising in the clinical learning environment
- Institutional support
- Projects should have the potential for dissemination to other sites

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Selection Process and Key Dates

September 3, 2024 Application deadline

December 2024 Grantees selected and all applicants notified

February 2025 Funding to commence
