Program Vision The Next Generation of Macy Faculty Scholars

We are eager to receive applications from:

- Early career faculty
- Even more <u>diverse faculty</u> from <u>diverse</u> <u>institutions</u> (e.g., geography, populations served, community based, research intensive)



Program Highlights

- Salary support for 50% protected time to pursue a mentored project at home institution (up to \$100K per year)
- Funds for project support and professional development (\$25K per year)
- Formal mentoring from a National Advisory Committee member and a Peer Mentor
- Harvard Macy Institute programs
- Macy Faculty Scholars Annual Meeting
- Access to other Macy grantees and programs

Eligibility Criteria

- Faculty member (doctorally prepared) at a school of medicine or nursing
- Early career, benefits-eligible faculty member (~3-8yrs)
- Nominated by dean of nursing or medical school
- Only 1 nominee per nursing or medical school



Eligibility Criteria

- Schools with a first-year Macy Faculty Scholar are precluded from nominating a candidate
- Identified faculty mentor who will provide advice on the proposed project, as well as on career development
- US citizen or permanent resident



Application

- Statement of career objectives and personal goals
- Project description
- Nominating letter from the dean
- Supporting letters from:
 - mentor
 - department chair
 - one other senior faculty member
- Biosketch of candidate and mentor



What Makes a Competitive Application?

- Viewed by learners as an effective educator
- In a position to directly influence learners in the local environment
- Ability to turn daily work into scholarship that has been disseminated
- Merit of proposed project and likelihood that it will influence national trends in health professions education
- Strong mentor
- Strong institutional support
- Potential to become a national leader in health professions education



Selection Process

- 1. Senior Macy staff review all complete applications and select semifinalists
- 2. National Advisory Committee reviews semifinalist applications and selects finalists
- 3. National Advisory Committee and senior Macy staff interview finalists (virtual) January 28 & 29, 2026
- 4. Selected Scholars notified late January 2026
- 5. Appointments begin July 1, 2026

- Jan. 28 & 29, 2026 Finalist interviews (virtual)
- Late Jan. 2026 Scholars and schools notified

- July 1, 2026 Appointment begins
